7.2 Public Information Workshop

Notice of a public information workshop (the Workshop), held on Thursday, May 28, 2015, was advertised in *The Washington Post* on April 22 and April 23, 2015; a copy of the notice and proof of the advertisement order is provided in Appendix B, Attachment B-3. Notice of the Workshop was also posted on the Authority's website (http://www.mwaa.com/news_publications/newsroom/public_notices).

The Workshop was held at the historic Main Terminal adjacent to Terminal A at DCA from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Representatives from the Authority and the Authority's EA consultant team preparing this EA were available to answer questions throughout the Workshop, and graphics were on display illustrating the Airport, the preliminary purpose and need for the proposed improvements, alternatives considered, the Authority's preferred alternative based on previous studies, the EA and scoping processes, and the potential schedules for completion of the EA process and implementation of the preferred alternative. The display boards used at the Workshop contained the same information that was included in the PowerPoint slide presentation for the agencies, which is provided in Appendix B, Attachment B-2.

One representative each from American Airlines, the Metropolitan Washington Airlines Committee, Travelers Aid International, and Teresa Pineda Davidson Consulting, LLC attended the Workshop.
