United Express Changing Concourses at Dulles

Flights at Concourse G will move to Concourse A

United Airlines will begin moving its United Express flights at Washington Dulles International Airport from Concourse G to newly-reopened Concourse A on Wednesday, April 19. This begins a transition period which will last until May 1. During this time, passengers should pay close attention to their flight's gate assignment. This information is displayed on monitors throughout the Main Terminal.

Concourse A has 35 gates for regional and commuter aircraft. Passengers can reach the concourse from the Main Terminal using an underground walkway to Concourse B, or by taking a mobile lounge from the dock just past the security screening checkpoints. Mobile lounge service is also available for passengers connecting between Concourses A, C, and D.

Concourse G is a temporary structure which has served United Express since 2004. Passengers can reach the concourse from the Main Terminal or from Concourse C using shuttles. Concourse G will remain open until United completes moving its regional flights to Concourse A. The concourse will eventually be demolished to clear the way for future airport construction projects.
